Update on Auckland Anatomic Pathology Service

For the past five years, MelNet has been advocating for improved funding and resourcing for pathology services nationwide, but particularly in Auckland. During this time our clinicians have frequently reported substantial delays in the turnaround of skin pathology results, and pathologists are reporting ever-increasing workloads and inadequate resourcing, funding and laboratory workspace.

On numerous occasions the MelNet Executive has raised concerns to health leaders about patient safety due to delayed and inadequate reporting of skin cancer and melanoma histology. We have been frustrated in our dealings with Government health officials to date – at most meetings, promises of action have been made which have not come to fruition, and constant restructuring and staff turnover means our primary point of contact is ever-changing.

Over the past months, we have managed to meet regularly with representatives from Health New Zealand – Auckland to discuss plans to address these issues within the Auckland region. In July MelNet, along with referrers to the Auckland Anatomic Pathology Service, were advised that International Accreditation New Zealand (IANZ) had suspended the accreditation of the Mt Wellington Histology Department due to delayed turnaround times of samples and facilities-associated constraints. This suspension does not impact the operation of the service but does require a marked improvement for the accreditation to be reinstated.

We have been assured that a short-term recovery plan is in place to restore the service to baseline levels over the coming months and planning for a sustainable longer-term solution is occurring in parallel. The MelNet Executive will continue to liaise with Health New Zealand on their progress – both in Auckland and nationwide – providing support wherever we can. We expect to be consulted on the longer-term plan for the Auckland Anatomic Pathology Service soon, along with other interested stakeholders. We invite <u>any feedback</u> on the current service nationwide that may assist us in our advocacy efforts and will share more details with you when we can.
