

Advocating for improved skin cancer management | Meeting with Minister Reti

Representatives from the MelNet Executive Committee are scheduled to meet with Minister Shane Reti this month to discuss how New Zealand can strengthen its response to skin cancer. Key priorities to be raised are:

- The need for greater focus on and investment in primary prevention
- The development of a national pathway for the early detection and management of skin cancer that is based in primary care and supported by secondary care services
- A structured education programme for healthcare professionals on skin cancer early detection and management, with a focus on those working in primary care
- Funding for adjuvant and neoadjuvant melanoma therapies

Outcomes of this meeting will be shared with the membership in due course.

NZ Skin Cancer Primary Prevention and Early Detection Strategy | Review in progress

MelNet has been commissioned by Health New Zealand | Te Whatu Ora to coordinate a review of the <u>NZ Skin</u> <u>Cancer Primary Prevention and Early Detection Strategy</u>, a document providing strategic direction and priorities for skin cancer prevention and early detection activities in New Zealand.

The document is currently being drafted. We will notify you of the consultation process in due course. This is expected to commence in July.
