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How much time does it take to make vitamin D? | Useful tool

Australian researchers have developed a tool to determine how much time it takes to make vitamin D.

This depends on the amount of skin covered by clothing and the intensity of UV radiation (indicated by the UV index). More skin exposed and higher UV index equate to less time needed.

The tool is embedded in this <u>article</u>. Scroll down to the graph titled "Time needed outdoors across the day in [season] to meet the daily vitamin D requirement". Hover your mouse over the lines to see the length of exposure needed at specific times of day.

As research scientist Dr Richard McKenzie explains in his <u>UV & You post about the tool</u>, unfortunately it gives times only for Australian sites. For New Zealand you can get a good idea by taking the city with the most similar latitude. For example, Auckland's latitude is close to Melbourne's, and Christchurch's latitude is similar to Hobart's.

UV Index tools

The UVI is a helpful guide on sun protection based on your current location. If the UVI is 3 or above, your skin can be damaged, so protection is required.

Interesting read: Real-World Outcomes of Immunotherapy for Melanoma Brain Metastases in New Zealand

MelNet Executive Committee members Dr Jody Jordan and Dr Annie Wong are among researchers who recently published a study about the outcomes of immunotherapy for melanoma brain metastases in New Zealand.

Most patients in the real-world study were symptomatic and received anti-PD1 monotherapy. The study concludes that approximately one-third of treated patients were alive at two years, but most patients remained symptomatic.

This highlights the need for more effective treatment and prospective management of their neurologic rehabilitation needs.
