Quality Statements to Guide Melanoma Diagnosis and Treatment in New Zealand | Under review

The National Melanoma Working Group will shortly be commencing a review of the *Quality Statements to Guide Melanoma Diagnosis and Treatment in New Zealand*. An updated draft is expected to be released for consultation around September this year.

Skin Cancer Prevention and Early Detection Strategy | What's been happening?

Since its launch in February, the Strategy has created valuable opportunities to strengthen skin cancer prevention and early detection efforts in New Zealand. Recent highlights include:

- Engaging with Government: MelNet has met with the Minister of Health, Health NZ, and the Labour Party's Health spokesperson to discuss ways to improve skin cancer outcomes. These conversations have been encouraging, with several Government agencies expressing a commitment to incorporating the Strategy recommendations into future planning.
- **Supporting local councils:** At the Green Pavlova Conference in Auckland, Dr Bronwen McNoe presented her research on shade provision in council-owned playgrounds. This sparked productive discussions with councils and suppliers about creating sun-safe public spaces.
- Raising awareness: In May, MelNet Chief Executive Katrina Patterson presented the Strategy at the Skin Cancer Congress, hosted by the Skin Cancer College of Australasia and attended by over 500 health professionals.
- **Fostering collaboration:** The Strategy has helped strengthen relationships between key non-Government organisations in the skin cancer sector, encouraging greater alignment and collaboration across individual work programmes.

New Pharmac funded melanoma treatments | Now available

The following medicines are now funded for stage IIIB to stage IV melanoma, subject to eligibility criteria:

- access to pembrolizumab has been widened for resectable stage IIIB to IV melanoma
- dabrafenib and trametinib is now funded for:
 - o resectable stage IIIB to IV BRAF mutated melanoma after surgery; and
 - o unresectable or metastatic BRAF mutated melanoma

Access to infliximab and tocilizumab for the management of immune checkpoint inhibitor-related toxicity has also been widened, subject to eligibility criteria.


Nurse-led models of service delivery for skin cancer detection | Interesting read

This recent research aimed to consolidate evidence on nurse-led models for skin cancer detection, examining their roles, comparing their effectiveness to physician-led care, and identifying any added benefits. The study found that nurse-led models show strong potential for high diagnostic accuracy, effective treatment delivery, and improved patient education on skin self-examination. Although role delineation remains a challenge, nurses play a crucial role in supporting skin specialists to meet the growing demand for skin cancer referrals.


