Shade in council managed outdoor spaces | NZ Playground Explorer app expanded

Earlier this year, Dr Bronwen McNoe, senior research fellow and co-director of the Social and Behavioural Research Unit at the University of Otago launched a web app with detailed filterable information and photographs of every council managed playground in New Zealand. Along with helping parents find a playground their children will enjoy, the app enables communities across New Zealand to be safe in the sun by helping them identify where they can find shade in playgrounds.

This app has now been expanded to include youth recreational spaces and swimming pools. As UV levels rise over the coming months, this app is an excellent tool to support healthy choices about where families spend time outdoors.

Pre- and post-treatment care for actinic keratoses: An Australian and New Zealand perspective

This article aims to provide recommendations for the pre-treatment and post-treatment care for actinic keratoses in order to improve patient outcomes, particularly in the Australian and New Zealand setting.

Management of Skin Toxicities in Cancer Treatment: An Australian/New Zealand Perspective

This review details twelve common dermatological toxicities encountered during cancer treatment and offers measures for their prevention and management, particularly in the Australian/New Zealand context where skincare requirements may differ to other regions due to higher cumulative sun damage caused by high ambient UV light exposure.

Interlaboratory variability of SPF results is considerable and likely greater than expected

This study examined the consistency of SPF test results when the same sunscreen was tested across different laboratories. It found considerable variation, particularly in products with higher SPF ratings. Despite careful procedures, differences in how sunscreen was applied and how skin responses were assessed led to significant discrepancies. The findings highlight the need for more reliable and standardised testing methods to ensure consumers can trust the protection promised by sunscreen products.
